

Kamchatka Brown Bear hunt spring 2025.

Western Kamchatka Peninsula Okhotsk Coastline

Hunt dates: - April 15th to May 15th

Duration: - 14 Days 8 days hunting

Group size: - 3 – 5 hunters in each camp 4 camps in total





Day 1: - Arrive in Petropavlovsk, from Vladivostok meet and greet by representative from hunting organisation, clear customs, and firearms. Transport to Esso village for overnight stay in hotel.

Day 2: - Transport to hunting camp by snowmobile or all terrain vehicle. Helicopter can also be used with cost divided between hunters.

Day 3 to Day 11: - Bear hunting.

Day 12: - Transfer to Esso by vehicle, snowmobile or helicopter overnight in hotel.

Day 13: - Transfer to Petropavlovsk overnight in hotel.

Day 14: - Depart Petropavlovsk for home.



Hunt cost includes: -

One trophy brown bear

Invitation for visa

Rifle permits

Transport to and from camp vehicle or snowmobile, depending on the area and number of hunters.

Guides and interpreter (AHC staff will accompany the entire trip)

Hunting license

Field preparation of trophies

Accommodation (heated cabins & tents) and meals

Please Note we now have 5 quality European rifles available for hire in camp at US\$250 per person including ammunition.



Not included in hunt cost: -

Helicopter transfers in and out of camp if required.

Airline tickets international and domestic flights

Transfers in Moscow between hotel and airport if required.

CITES US\$200

Hotel accommodation before and after the hunt including meals

Alcoholic drinks in camp

Shipping of trophies and taxidermy work

Tips (no obligation)

Personal items and travel insurance



Hunting method: -

Hunting is carried out by spotting tracks from snowmobiles. Some walking is necessary when a trophy bear is spotted before taking the shot. For this it is advisable to use snowshoes and ski poles, these are easily purchased in Petropavlovsk prior to the hunt. Although it is spring it will still be cold so suitable clothing will be necessary including sunglasses or snow goggles.

Price: - US\$13,000 plus US\$2,500 trophy fee upon harvest

Second bear (when available) US\$5,500

**Getting there: -**

Hunters need to travel via Moscow or Vladivostok then to Petropavlovsk, Emirates and Turkish airlines have daily flight from Dubai and Istanbul to Moscow and are easily connected from departure points around the world. For those hunters traveling from the Pacific region, they will fly via Bangkok and Vladivostok.



Summary: -

For those wanting to take a large brown bear at a reasonable price this hunt represents great value as the same coastal bear hunt in Alaska will cost around US\$35,000 to US\$45,000 for a yacht-based hunt. Russia is a friendly destination, and the people are very hospitable, and the guides and staff will make every effort to secure that trophy bear you have always dreamed of.
